Amenity area at Eagle Glen (off Jones Street)

The residents of Eagle Glen are the custodians of this amenity area and pay, as part of their factors charge, for its upkeep and maintenance. However, there have been instances lately where dog waste is not being picked up, or it is being bagged but left at the entrance to this area. Fife Council will not provide any dog waste bins as the amenity area is privately owned. In order to maintain this area for everyone to use without fear of treading on dog waste (especially children) we ask all dog walkers to clean up after their pets and take their waste home.

Dog Fouling

It is very disappointing to note that a few irresponsible dog owners are not picking up dog waste in particular around areas where children congregate. Please think about other residents.

Bloom in Kingseat

Established as a group in 2005, Bloom in Kingseat have provided improvements to the landscape and added many floral displays around the village, winning numerous awards along the way from Beautiful Fife and Keep Scotland Beautiful. Last year they took a break from entering any of these campaigns, but continued to plant and maintain the floral displays admired by the local community and those passing through the village.

This year the committee have decided to re-enter the Beautiful Fife campaign; plants have been ordered and will be planted in mid-June. The group has seen a reduction in volunteers recently and would welcome help to plant, maintain and water the displays. Watering of the hanging baskets and planters is an important part of providing displays that are healthy and vibrant. This is done using an electrically driven and pumped 40-gallon watering trolley which can be operated by one person or a two-person team.

Kingseat is a wonderful place to live; Bloom in Kingseat needs your help to continue with the vision of its founder, Colin Smith, who wished to provide a colourful village landscape where all would be proud to live.

Without your help the existence of Bloom in Kingseat in its current form is uncertain. Please help us to plant and maintain the floral displays and undertake watering of planters.
